 - <u>VP Schleich</u>: Friendly amendment you should change this to the student majority of the GAF committee.
 - <u>Senator Rust:</u> we are also going to have to friendly amend the amounts its actually \$31,500.
 - o <u>CFO Lannerd:</u> We are also going to have to update the account numbers
 - <u>Senator Lewis:</u> I see 5 clubs that got 0% of their allocation
 - o <u>CFO Lannerd:</u> yes, for fly fishing everything they need is through

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rebranding, for Health and Fitness Club was for personally training certificates which SOAP cannot be used for, Study Dakota which is not an active organization, Hard Rocker hocky also needs to go through rebranding. InterVarsity, their original budget was in the \$7,000 range so they amended to 0 because they got a large donation but we put them down for 0.01 so they could ask for supplemental. For SASE they didn't present.

- <u>VP Schleich:</u> That 10% was after initial deductions.
- D. Resolution 23.S.015 Constitution Revisions
 - <u>Senator Rust:</u> Friendly amend so we can change VP Schliech's name.
 - <u>Senator Siekmann:</u> Upon talking with some senators, maybe we change the constitution. Rather than running on a position by credit hours, instead it you should be able to run on credit hours or year.
 - Senator Rust: Just changing that to and or. People have some classes in their class standing, whereas people in the dorms will talk to people within their year.
 - VP Schleich: I think that the addition of an and or would help in some cases for example if someone went on co-op.
 - Senator Van Ruler: I ran under my year standing not under my class standing.
 - Senator Rust: I think changing it might be ideal so we can be sure we are following our constitution
 - Senator Archer: I feel like this might be better for my peers.

- <u>Director Headly:</u> maybe we talk to Vickie Bender to see if there's something we could change the system.
- <u>Senator Jurrens</u>: is there going to be anything added to vacancies? Because only the president is talked about right now.
- Senator Jurrens: Last year when Marrin left no one knew what we supposed to do, and VP is a big position to fill so I feel it would be smart to have this laid out.
- <u>Dean Dlugos:</u> In the rare event when the president and VP are gone we need a chain of command.
- <u>VP Schleich:</u> we have that laid out somewhere in the constitution.
- <u>Director Headly:</u> what does eligible replacement mean, we have had some questions about that for replacements.

- <u>Senator Alarape:</u> is Trap Shooting Club supposed to be doing a presentation today?
- Senator Lewis: Trap Club is doing a presentation the following week after spring break.
- <u>VP Schleich:</u> the President's office is looking to change the commencement to only be in the spring and not the winter.
- Senator Jurrens: why?
- Dean Dlugos: The curriculum with mechanical engineering changed making it near impossible to graduate in the winter so now graduation in the winter is a very small amount of people. We are also trying to be more

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- in line with other schools and there are only 3 schools that have winter graduation.
- Senator Siekmann: what would that mean for students that are done in the winter? Would they not have a degree?
- Dean Dlugos: They would have a degree but if they wanted to walk, they would have to do it in the spring.
- Senator Else: Could we have an informal one in the winter instead of a large-scale ceremony and when would this go into effect?
- Dean Dlugos: We discussed. This.
 And this would go into effect in 2024.

8. CFO Report

- Thank you to the soap committee and GAF for meeting extra times this week to get things ready for the coming weeks. And helping us come up with a SOAP number that is fiscally responsible
- We have 2 main accounts connected to SOAP 4SA002 and 4SA003, 4SA003 is what you see when referencing supplementals. At beginning of the fiscal year we had \$626 thousand in 4SA002 we then allocated our SOAP budget, our rebranding budget, and our safety committee budget out of our 002 account into our 003 account. Additionally, as we've made supplemental requests money is transferred from 002 to 003. Our current. Our current balance in our reserve fund is \$296 thousand we have transferred \$423 thousand in 003. We have spent \$145 thousand of this

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money.

- We landed on \$315 thousand for SOAP, they currently have \$375 thousand set aside for SOAP. There are non-club things that also use that money those things being the Cultural Expo and Rocker Days the costs of which add up to about \$20 thousand they do have some reserve money of their own. All of GAF does not roll back into our reserve only SOAP related portions. The rest of GAF rolls back into a different reserve. If there's a shortfall in GAF funding, there is a possibly they will pull out money from that reserve to give what was promised to us. I will put together a short presentation 2 weeks from now.
- Currently we are not sustainable. We chose \$315 thousand by looking at what was allocated for SOAP during FY '22 and FY 23 and just going in the middle. This gives us at least 2 years to fix the budget.
- we are petitioning the state for a GAF increase of \$1.17 which at 13 credits is going to add \$35 to each students expenses. The expected revenue from that is about \$73 thousand.
- For SOAP we are looking to rewrite parts of the SOAP constitution we are looking to tie the increase to the South Dakota CPI
- VP Schleich: We need to note that more clubs are made then are removed so each year there are more clubs fighting over that small increase. So that is something that should be looked into in the future.


