- B) ITS Bryan Schumacher, Jason Erikson, Zane Tibke
 - <u>Schumacher:</u> we are up to 100 gigabyte internet on campus now.
 - President Kessinger: personal hotspots, has there been any more discussion on the issues with them?
 - Schumacher: from the admirative level, all the time. But nothing has gotten higher than that.
 - <u>Tibke:</u> there are over 60 rogue access points at any given time. One can cause an issue. We can't fix system stability until then we have few hotspots.
 - <u>President Kessinger</u>: there have been quite a few instances on campus of people resorting to hotspots due to issues with internet on campus.
 - Schumacher: a few years ago, there was discussion about bans. It almost got past but students realized that they could use the hotspot on their phone if they had problems. If we could make it so we would ban all other rogue access points excluding mobile hotspots.
 - Senator Thom: so, what's stopping us from banning everything but hotspots?

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o Schumacher: yes, we could actually do that. o VP Lewis: just for clarification, last administration there was changes proposed that died in discussion. Senator Lockwood: what I've noticed is most issues is the WPA network most notably within the library. o Tibke: there are several changes we can make to alleviate this issue, but we cannot just start pushing those out without any thought. Senator Alarape: one of the biggest things to help students understand what's happening is letting students know what's going on. Tibke: we did alert the help desk what's going on. o Shumacher: we should probably send out an email just to make sure students know what's happening. 5.
