### **Department Highlights**

#### **New Faculty Member**



Dr. **Paul May** joined the Department as an Assistant Professor in Fall 2023. Dr May has degrees in Mathematics and Computational Sciences & Statistics from SDSU and USD, and did postdoctoral research at UM-College Park before coming to Mines.

Dr. May's research focuses on using Global Ecosystem Dynamics Investigation (GEDI) satellite data to answer questions about environmental change and sustainability.

In only his first month at Mines, Dr. May was awarded a \$460K grant from the US Forest Service to model spatial-temporal trends in US forests using satellite and field inventory data.

Dr. **Kyle Caudle** was awarded a \$91K grant from the National Institute of Standards and Technology to investigate population masking for communications systems and data sharing.

### **Department Highlights**

#### **Data Miners Win Again! And Again!**





The Data Miners, the department's competitive student data science team, continues to win at competitions.

The Data Miners took 3<sup>rd</sup> place at the Spring 2023 MinneAnalytics competition at Target Field modeling game attendance for the Minnesota Twins.

Most recently, they took 1<sup>st</sup> place in the regional NASA Space Apps Hackathon challenge. This means they move on to the global competition (and the possibility of watching a NASA launch).

#### **Other Highlights**

- The Slide Rule Math Help Center is fully operation in the Devereaux Library, serving students in Precalculus through Calculus II. It serves between about 450 students and logs in over 2000 contact hours each month!
- The West River Math Contest continues to grow, last year hosting 450 middle- and highschoolers. Thanks to \$5K in Day of Giving contributions, we were able to provide campus tours and free lunch in Surbeck for all participants!
- Math faculty were invited speakers at several conferences, including Travis Kowalski (MAA MathFest '23), Marti Garlick (AAPT Winter '24).
- 2023 IR report over past 10 years of data show that students who take their P2C2 at Mines are 10-15% more likely to pass later MATH classes and 10% more likely to graduate and earn a degree from Mines.





### **Academic Affairs & Enrollment**

#### **Enrollment Management**

- Applications for first-time freshman and transfer students are rolling in. We are up in acceptances for first-time freshman versus last year and up over the four-year average.
- The free application period began on October 1 and includes all the states that are part of the South Dakota Advantage.

#### **Academics**

- A non-tenure track review committee has been created to review the promotion dossiers for faculty in the lecturer and professor of practice track.
- The PhD in Chemistry and Biology was approved at the October BOR meeting!

#### **Student Success**

- Our Navigate strategic leader from EAB was on campus in October to visit with success advisors, academic advisors, department heads, and administration and to see how the Navigate product is being used to support students and how EAB can provide further support for new features.
- A new writing center will be established in the library building to help students, especially with respect to thesis and dissertations.








### **Cumulative Number of Awards by Month FY20-FY24**







### Cumulative Value of Awards (\$ K) by Month FY20-FY24
