





- Begin the FY25 departmental budget hearing process
  - Budget Development Committee consists of: The President, the Provost, the VP of Finance, Budget Director, and Controller
  - Because of our tight budget, these hearings have principally been to review the financial situation in each department and ensure that the strategic plan is being followed.
  - Reviews of credit hour production, graduates, faculty workload, and grant activity are performed for all academic departments.
  - Administrative departments are reviewed for efficiencies and effectiveness.
- Begin the FY25 Legislative Process
  - Legislature JCA FY25 Budget Presentation (January 22-23)
    - The process ends in March with the Legislature appropriating FY25 state general funds and determining salary policy

## **2024 Minimum Wage Increase**



Any students who are below the \$11.20 per hour will be brought up to \$11.20 effective with the January pay period that begins December 22, 2023. 




## **Cumulative Number of Awards by Month FY20-FY24**







## Cumulative Value of Awards (\$ K) by Month FY20-FY24
